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Safeguarding information for parents

TikTok-What is it? ☐ ☐ ☐

Katie Cain (Police, Cyber Harm Reduction, Durham)

It's a social media app that gives users the opportunity to share 60 second short videos with friends, family, or the entire world. The videos range from funny sketches to lip sync videos with special effects. It is very popular with users under 16 years.

The minimum age is 13 according to TikTok's terms and conditions.

What are the risks?

When you download the app users can see ALL the content without creating an account, although they are not able to post, like or share anything until they've set up an account on the app.

By default, all accounts are public, so anyone on the app could potentially see what your child shares however only approved users can send them messages. There is the potential that users can be contacted by strangers on the app.

What can I do to keep safe on the app?

People should be aware of cyber bullying, and that any online platform can be a forum for this. Ensure you are aware of the reporting tools and how to delete users and report them.

Set your account to private: You can approve or deny users and limit incoming messages to followers only. However note that even with a private account, profile photos, usernames and bio's are still visible, so ensure that these do not give away personal information or are inappropriate.

Children may be tempted to gain more 'likes' or 'follows' on the app by doing something inappropriate, so it's important to have a conversation with your child about what they are sharing and who with.

Stress with any children using the app the importance of their digital footprint, and who they communicate with online. 'Stranger danger' is very much applicable in the online world as well as the physical world.

Parents are advised – as with other apps to help their child review their privacy settings and to be aware that: "Even with a private account, profile information – including profile photo, username, and bio – will be visible to all users. Counsel your child not to reveal personal information such as age, address, or phone number in his/her profile."

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Smapchat



Snapchat is a photo messaging app with a twist and appeals to people of all ages. You can take photos, record videos, add text and filters, and then share them with friends. These 'snaps' aren't saved by default, and you can control how long viewers can view the 'snap' (ranging from 1-10 seconds). If someone screenshots a 'snap' that has been sent to them, Snapchat will notify the sender of this.

Age restricted? YES

Snapchat is not intended for use by children under the age of 13.



Who can my child communicate with?

You can add friends from your mobile contacts, their snapchat username, by Snapcode, or with the Add Nearby feature. Ensure that your child's security settings are up to date and that they are only communicating with real friends on the app.



Can I control location settings?

There are 3 location settings to choose from on Snapchat: Ghost Mode, My Friends, and Select Friends. Ghost mode means that you are the only person who can physically see your location on the Map. You can still see your friends but they cannot see you.

My Friends means that all of your contacts on Snapchat can see your location.

Select Friends means that users can look through their friends list and then decide which of their friends they want to be able to view their location.

What Can I do to protect my child?

Have regular conversations around who they are communicating with on Snapchat. If necessary, regularly sit down and get them to show you who is in their contact list. Explain the significance of a 'Digital Footprint', and also around sending appropriate messages. Remind your child that sending sexual messages and images is against the law. Urge them to report any inappropriate behaviour to Snapchat, and also make their parents/guardians aware so that it can be reported to the police if necessary.

REMEMBER-Screenshots can be taken of 'snaps' that are sent, however the sender will be notified. Make sure your child is aware of the risks around this, and also with sharing inappropriate content.

Can you block users?

By blocking someone in Snapchat, this will mean they are prevented from sending 'snaps', chats, or viewing your stories. Deleting someone means they will no longer show up in your friends list, but it doesn't necessarily mean that they will not be able to view your 'snaps'.
