### JRSO Community Speed Watch

On Thursday our JRSO's worked with the PCSO's to record the speed of traffic outside our school. Please find the results below.

#### 30/1/2018 - Time of check - 14:10pm - 14.30pm

Two vehicles were recorded at 31 mph and 32 mph and a total of 91 vehicles passed through community speed watch.

#### 30/1/2018 - Time of check - 14.30pm - 14.50pm

Zero vehicles recorded as speeding and a total of 88 vehicles passed through community speed watch.

#### 31/1/2018 – Time of check 9:50am – 10:15am

Zero vehicles recorded as speeding and total of 116 vehicles passed through community speed watch.

During school drop off and collection times the speed limit has reduced to 20mph with the flashing lights to indicate this. At all other times the limit is 30mph.
