This week FROG group met with some new members and Miss Mitchell, our Chair of Governors, who is now also a member. We looked at the Collective Worship timetable for this term which outlines when FROG group lead Collective Worship in classes. We then spent some time looking at Bible quotes linked to our School Values of thankfulness, trust, hope, forgiveness and friendship. After that members of the group visited each classroom to review their Refection Area. The session ended with FROG group members being set a challenge to make a welcoming leaflet for visitors to our school.

Christian Aid week

Christian Aid strives for a new world transformed by an end to poverty, and campaigns to change the rules that keep people poor. It is an agency of the churches in the UK and Ireland, working wherever need is greatest irrespective of religion or race. Christian Aid believes in strengthening people to find their own solutions to the problems they face, and so supports local organisations, which are best placed to understand local needs, as well as giving help on the ground through 16 overseas offices. This year Christian Aid week is the week beginning Sunday 14th May. On Tuesday 16th May Mrs Gregory (Head of RE) and a class of students from Easington Academy are coming to our school to help our children explore this years theme around refugees and their plight. During the day children the Academy students will work with each class to explore the challenges facing refugees - we are also lucky to be joined again by Emma who works for Christian Aid who will lead our worship. To raise funds for this charity we are inviting children to bring their own backpack to school for the day along with a suggested donation of £1.FROGgroup will also be selling hot chocolate and cookies at breaktime for £1.
