#### **Harvest Gift Day**

Our Harvest Gift Day will coincide with the mid week communion service at St. Mary's on Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> October which all children will attend. Once again this year we have chosen to support FEED - The Food Emergency East Durham Project. FEED has already seen over 1000 food parcels distributed via a network of volunteers to those in crisis situations, providing a much needed life line to more than 600 individuals and 400 vulnerable families. Please send donations of food items such as tinned beans, fruit or vegetables, dried pasta, rice, cereals or other items which are non perishable into school on Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> October. Thank you.

#### **Packed Lunch Policy**

Our SNAG (School Nutrition Action Group) met last week and the children in the group asked if parents could be reminded of our Packed Lunch Policy. Following the introduction of School Food Standards from the Government ,our SNAG group, in conjunction with Taylor Shaw our meals provider, developed this policy in consultation with parents, pupils and governors. As part of the School Food Plan, a new set of standards for all food served in schools was launched by the Department for Education. They become **mandatory** in all maintained schools, and new academies and free schools from January 2015.

Packed lunches **should** include: at least one portion of fruit and one portion of vegetables every day.

meat, fish or other source of nondairy protein (e.g. lentils, kidney beans, chickpeas, houmous or falafel) every day.

oily fish, such as salmon, tuna at least once every three weeks.

a starchy food such as any type of bread, pasta, rice, couscous, noodles, potatoes or other type of cereals every day.

dairy food such as milk, cheese, yoghurt, fromage frais or custard everyday.

only water or still diluted juice .

Packed lunches **should not i**nclude snacks such as crisps. (Instead, include seeds, vegetables and fruit with no added salt, sugar or fat savoury crackers or breadsticks served with fruit, vegetables or dairy food)

confectionery such as chocolate bars, chocolate-coated biscuits and sweets. (Cakes and biscuits are allowed but encourage your child to eat these only as part of a balanced meal.)

highly processed foods such as Dairylea dunkers, Cheese Strings, Fruit Winders

pastry products such as sausage rolls, individual pies and pasties

nuts

Please note that if items from the above (not) list are brought into school these will be taken from children and then returned at the end of the school day. Children will be reminded of the list of items that are acceptable

#### A reminder of our Attendance Procedures

Unauthorised absence is given when:

- A child arrives after 9.30 a.m. without a medical reason
- A child is absent and the reason is not medical or has not been authorised by the Headteacher.

Parents are asked to **contact** school to explain their children's absence before 9.30 a.m. on that school day. The reason must be medical if it is to be authorised. Other circumstances must have been given permission by the Headteacher. Following the child's return to school **a letter** to explain the absence should be sent into school so that the appropriate mark can be put into the attendance register. Until this letter is received a child's attendance remains as **unauthorised**. We regularly review attendance and unauthorised attendance may result in a Fixed Penalty Notice.

Amendments to the 2006 regulations in September 2013 **remove** references to family holiday and extended leave as well as the statutory threshold of ten school days. The amendments make clear that headteachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. Headteachers should determine the number of school days a child can be away from school if the leave is granted.

If parents do not apply for leave of absence, or follow the correct procedure, the absence will be considered to be unauthorised which could result in an application for a Fixed Penalty Notice.

Please note these procedures are in line with Durham LA guidance and have been ratifies by our Governing Body.

#### **Sponsored Run**

Earlier this week your child will have brought home a letter and a Sponsor Form regarding our Sponsored run on Wednesday 12<sup>th</sup> October. Please try to get a couple of sponsors for your child for this fundraising activity. All proceeds will go into School Fund. Our School Fund subsides visits and visitors for our children and buys other resources in school. Please send sponsor money into school by Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> October. Thank you in advance for your support.

Hate crime is when someone picks on you because they think you are different in some way. This can be because of things like

- Where you come from
- Your disability
- Your religion

Hate crime can be lots of different things like

- Bullying you
- Stealing from you
- Breaking or damaging your things
- Hitting you
- Calling you names

Hate crime is wrong - you do not have to put up with it. If these things are happening to you or someone you know tell the police about it and we can work together to stop it happening.

**Reporting hate crime** If you have been a victim or have seen a hate crime it is important that you report it.

- We make sure victims of hate crime get the best possible support
- Reporting hate crime can stop it from happening to someone else
