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Cyber Crime Trends Durham And Darlington

What cyber crime has been happening in Durham and Darlington?

Below are the top 3 cyber enabled frauds by volume that have occurred last month in the Durham and Darlington area. We urge everyone to remain vigilant and protect yourselves when online.

1)Online Shopping & Auctions: These have included reports of sellers being targeted by the fake Paypal email scam.

2)Computer Software Service Fraud: Numerous reports have come in whereby victims have reported that they have received pop up warnings of computer viruses/issues and to phone the associated number to rectify the problem. The criminals then request a payment from the victim for computer protection.

3)Dating Scams.

These are the top 3 cyber dependant offences by volume:

1)Computer virus spyware/malware: Reports of viruses/malware have been recorded as text message scams offering free supermarket vouchers if the victim clicks a link. Upon Clicking the link either personal details are requested or they are taken to a blank page which presumably has led to a malicious download. Can also be emails claiming to be from a trusted source but contain malicious attachments.

2)Hacking-social media & email: Paypal, Instagram, Email etc.

3)Hacking-personal: Personal reports have been recorded as computer software service fraud

Games Console Advice For Parents

Fortnite, Minecraft, Xbox, RDR 2, PS4, VR, COD, Black Ops 4, Switch

This isn't a nonsense language made up by us in the office-they are all terms related to games consoles and will no doubt form part of children's (and adults!) Christmas lists this year.

If you are buying a child a games console for Christmas make sure that you are aware of potential risks around them and promote safe gaming. Not clued up on the latest games consoles?

Have a look at our top questions to ask when buying a games console for children:

- ·How do I know if games have online multiplayer?
- •Does this gaming device have internet access? What does this allow you to do online?
- •Is it possible to monitor internet use and manage what content my child can access?
- •How can this gaming console/game be used to communicate with people online, and is it through voice chat or direct messages?
- •Can my child run up a bill on this gaming device? Is there a way to restrict or monitor spending?
- •Do I need a valid credit/debit card to set up anything on the device?
- •How do I protect my child's identity/my identity when using a console?
- •What personal information (eg date of birth, real name) can be viewed on the console?
- •What security measures can I put in place to protect personal information?
- •Can I put in place different parental settings for different family members?
