School meal payments Spring Term 1 2017

School meals cost £2 per day - £10 per week and payments are collected in advance on the first day of the school week (please ensure payments are paid promptly if they are paid weekly). The cost for the next half-term is £60.00 (six full weeks @£10). We particularly welcome payments by cheque (either on a weekly or monthly basis) and these should be made payable to Durham County Council. If paying in cash please send the correct money. All payments should be placed in an envelope clearly marked with the child's name. If your child wishes to change their lunch arrangement please inform Mrs Bowden-Stoker in writing with at least a week's notice. Thank you.

Last week every child took home a Fire Fighters Charity bag. Please try to fill the bag with old clothes, shoes, and handbags and return it to school on Tuesday 28th February – please only on this day as we have nowhere to store these filled bags. Our school will receive a payment (depending on the weight we collect) for our School Fund.
