


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

#### JRSOs (Junior Road Safety Officers) in action

On Tuesday our JRSOs worked with PSCOs and Cllr Surtees to monitor the speed of traffic going past our school. During their monitoring most cars travelled at a safe speed (under 30 miles an hour) however four cars were recorded at travelling over 35 miles an hour. Our JRSOs recognise the need for drivers to take care when travelling past our school.

"We did a speed watch - the computer told us how fast the cars were going. If cars slow down outside of our school it would stop people getting hurt" Max Y5

"If the cars go really fast they could hurt someone crossing the road. I think it's really important what we did." Ava Y5

"I really enjoyed looking at the different types of cars. We saw someone going over 40 mph. I think it will help people to understand that they need to drive at the right speed so that they don't cause an accident." Tilly Y4

Our JRSOs would also like to remind adults to park safely and considerately outside of school. If possible they ask that adults use the "park and stride" approach – parking a little further away from school and then walking the rest of the way. Keep up the hard work JRSOs – Mrs Swift



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
