Sport Premium 2013-2014

What is Sport Premium?

Sport Premium is an amount of money which the government has agreed to allocate to schools. The funding amount schools receive is based upon the number of children of primary age the school has at Jan. of that year. The sport premium is to be used to

Increase the quality & breadth of PE & Sport provision, and increasing participation in PE & Sport.

At Easington Church of England Primary School we strive to promote healthy and active lifestyles and aim to provide sporting opportunities for all our pupils. Our school aims to be "Happy, healthy and fulfilled"

The 2013-2014 Sport Premium funding for Easington Church of England Primary School was £9,163

The money was used for:

1) Investing in the Easington School Sport Partnership Service Level Agreement £5000 to provide the school with the following:

- Support to develop an annual bespoke P.E. & Sport action plan.
- Curriculum support and high quality CPD for teachers, teaching assistants, NQTs, team teaching, twilights, professional development days etc.
- Provision of High Quality Coaching support across a variety of sports.
- A full organised annual programme of competitions/tournaments/festivals **in addition** to the National School Games.
- Participation, inclusion and excellence opportunities.
- Access to the gifted & talented multi-skill academy for Year 5 & 6 children.
- Provision of an after-school activity in every term in a variety of sports.
- SSP Network meetings to support PE Co-ordinators / PLTs in their role developing PE & sport within their school.
- Opportunities for young leaders to practise their skills through volunteering in schools.
- Assistance in the process of applying for national 'Kitemark' status for High Quality Provision of P.E. & School Sport.
- Promotion and development of links to local sports club.
- Network of Change4life clubs.
- Central co-ordination of school sport programmes in SSP area.

2) Our PE Subject Leader (a specialist PE teacher) now teaches one PE lesson to every class weekly and has an Action Plan to further raise aspirations in PE. We have rearranged our staffing to accommodate this provision.

3) We have bought a container where we now store our PE equipment £2720. This is to alleviate much needed space in school and provide safer access to our equipment.

4) Paying our subscription to the Youth Sport Trust membership £300

The impact of this funding

As this is a brand new initiative, the school will monitor its impact over the next two years. Our outcomes will be published on the website in due course, and as a result, the plan may be modified.

The school has assessed impact in the following ways:

- PE Action Plan – monitored and evaluated
- As a result of our commitment to PE and competitive Sport we have recently been accredited with the Gold Mark from youth Sport Trust and the Silver Award from Sainsbury's School Games.
- Every child in school receives two hours of PE teaching every week.

- We participate in and are successful at cluster competitions.
- We hold an annual intra-school sports event and this year intend to develop intra-school sports activities to occur every half-term.
- Feedback from parents (following a Parents curriculum Evening) and children is positive and will help guide our next PE plan.
- Head teacher reports on a termly basis to Governors how the money is being spent via the Head teachers report to Governors. The PE Subject Leader will lead a session during the next CSC committee meeting to share developments in PE.
- We have links with Peterlee Tennis Club, Hartlepool United Football Club, Sunderland Football Club, Horden Rugby Club, Durham Athletics association, Easington Colliery cricket club and promote other local sporting clubs.
- Our Subject Leader is providing a FUNS after school club which targets our YR children and their families and Sunderland Light Foundation are working with families and children in school to deliver a Family Learning programme.
- A selection of our KS2 children attend weekly swimming lessons.
- Our Y5/6 children are given the opportunity to attend a four day residential which includes many Outdoor and Adventurous activities.
- Throughout the year we offer After School Clubs for:
