Pupil Premium Funding 2012-2013

Our school receives Pupil Premium Funding as part of its budget based on the number of children who:

- Are on Free School Meals,
- Have been on Free School Meals at any time during their time at Primary School,
- Are children of services personnel, or
- Have been in looked after care for 6 months or more

In 2012/13 the school received £7,600 in Pupil Premium funding.

How the 2012/13 funding was spent

The funding was used

- to increase Teaching Assistant time across the school to ensure personalised learning for all children and to close the gap between Free School Meals and non-Free School Meals pupils
- to deliver intervention programmes to raise standards and close the gap between Free School Meals and non-Free School Meals pupils, such Better Reading Partnership and Friendship group
- · to contribute towards the cost of visits to ensure children can access school visits

Impact of Pupil Premium Money

Maths: PP children made similar progress (2APS) and less progress (4APS) than non PP children. Reading: PP children made less progress (2APS) and similar progress (4APS) than non PP children

Writing: PP children made less progress (2APS) and better progress (4APS) than non PP children
