## Pupil Premium Funding 2014-2015

Our school receives Pupil Premium Funding as part of its budget based on the number of children who:

- Are on Free School Meals,
- Have been on Free School Meals at any time during their time at Primary School,
- Are children of services personnel, or
- Have been in looked after care for 6 months or more
- Are subject to a residency order or were adopted after being in care since 31<sup>st</sup> September 2005.

In 2014-2015 the school received £27,000 in Pupil Premium funding.

### How the 2014-2015 funding will be spent:

The funding will be used:

- to employ a teacher for 1.5 days to increase the capacity for small group teaching and to focus intervention appropriately to PP children
- to fund more Teaching Assistant time to ensure personalised learning for all children and to deliver intervention programmes to raise standards such as Better Reading Partnership and Friendship group
- to contribute towards the cost of visits to ensure children can access school visits

1.5 Teacher	£6,500
0.9 Teaching Assistant time	£19,500
Access to school visits	£1,000

### Impact of Pupil Premium Money

The aim of Pupil Premium funding is to close the gap between Free School Meals and non-Free School Meals pupils. We will monitor the progress of these groups of pupils and report to the Governing Body at the end of the year.
