The Pupil Premium



The Pupil Premium, which was introduced to support learning, is allocated to children from low-income families who are currently known to be eligible for FSM in both mainstream and non-mainstream settings and children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months. The Government has decided that eligibility for the Pupil Premium in 2012-13 will be extended to pupils who have been eligible for free school meals (FSM) at any point in the last 6 years.

Schools are free to spend their Pupil Premium in whatever way they decide, as long as they consider this will have a positive impact on the pupils for which it was allocated. During 2011/2012 Easington Church of England Primary School were allocated £6,600 for 11 pupils. We chose to spend Pupil Premium on purchasing Teaching Assistant support to support the learning of pupils.
