Sport Premium funding 2014 2015

Sport Premium is an amount of money which the government has agreed to allocate to schools. The funding amount schools receive is based upon the number of children of primary age the school has at Jan. of that year. The sport premium is to be used to Increase the quality & breadth of PE & Sport provision, and increasing participation in PE & Sport.

At Easington Church of England Primary School we strive to promote healthy and active lifestyles and aim to provide sporting opportunities for all our pupils.

The 2014-2015 Sport Premium funding for Easington Church of England Primary School is £8,515

The money is being used for:

- 1) Investing in a Sport and PE Apprentice. The apprentice will:
 - Support the work of school staff to deliver high quality PE and school sport including dinner and after school activities as well as curriculum lessons.
 - Prepare, assist, lead and review PE and school sport sessions.
 - Contribute to joint working with other organisations.
 - Support the development of PE and school sport.
 - Set up, take down and store activity equipment.
 - Assist with the management of school sports teams.
 - Support the organisation of intra and inter school competitions
 - Promote Health, Safety and Welfare in PE and school sport.
 - Support Equality and Diversity in PE and school sport.

- 2) Our PE Subject Leader (a specialist PE teacher) teaches one PE lesson to every class weekly and this year will work alongside teachers to further improve the quality of learning and teaching in PE.

- 3) We spend a proportion of the funding to provide transport for children to and from sporting events and activities.

- 4) Purchasing Youth Sport Trust membership and attendance at YST annual conference.

- 5) Purchasing a football kit, cricket wear and athletics wear

- 6) Purchasing equipment for children to use at playtimes and lunchtimes (supported by our Sport and PE apprentice)

The targets within our School Improvement Plan linked to Sport and PE funding are:

- to improve the quality of learning and teaching in PE so that it is at least consistently good
- to improve after school activity involvement from 53% (2013 2014) to 70%

What we provide:

Every child in school receives the equivalent of two hours of PE teaching every week (sometimes demands on our curriculum time mean some weeks children receive less time and sometimes they receive more – this equates over the year)

We participate in and are successful at cluster competitions

We hold an annual intra-school sports event and this year intend to develop intra-school sports activities to occur every half-term.

We have links with Peterlee Tennis Club, Hartlepool United Football Club, Sunderland Football Club, Horden Rugby Club, Durham Athletics association, Easington Colliery cricket club and promote other local sporting clubs.

Our Subject Leader is providing a FUNS after school club which targets our YR children and their families and Sunderland Light Foundation are working with families and children in school to deliver a Family Learning programme.

Our Y3 children attend weekly swimming lessons.

Our Y5/6 children are given the opportunity to attend a four day residential which includes many Outdoor and Adventurous activities.

Throughout the year we offer After School Clubs for:

Football Netball Gymnastics Tennis Multi skills Tag Rugby Hockey Cricket Health and Fitness

As a result of our commitment to PE and competitive Sport we have recently been accredited with the Silver Award from Sainsburys School Games.

We hold the Gold Active Mark.
