Before you begin.... Can you spot how each new term in the Fibonacci sequence is made?

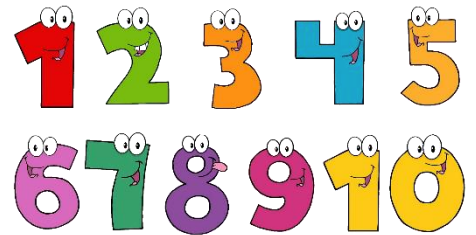
Here are the first few **square** numbers:
