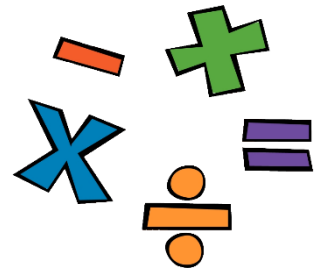




## Maths
