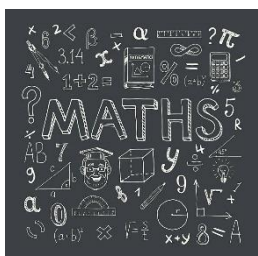


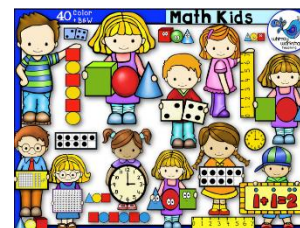


### Maths

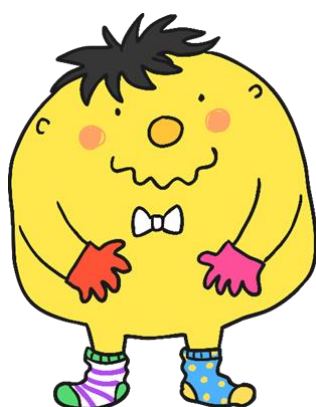
