Contingency Plan for EYFS in the event of a partial or full lockdown

This document outlines the strategic steps that have been put in place to address issues related to a partial (EYFS - single class bubble) lockdown or a full school (all children) lockdown due to the outbreak of Covid -19. It is essential that the children's learning is facilitated by school to maximise the time spent away from school and to lessen the damaging effects of time away from the school environment.

Home school learning:

In the event of the above occurring, when children leave the school premises on the day lockdown is confirmed (14 -day isolation period), they will take home the following items home:

- Single sounds phonic booklets

The following day, the EYFS teacher will upload a range of activities on to the school website, which will be a direct reflection of the EYFS curriculum the children would have been accessing had they been in school. This process will be repeated at the beginning of each week. It is essential that phonic work is completed in their booklet as directed by the teacher. It is a requirement that this booklet be returned to school once the period of lockdown is ended.

The range of weekly activities will include:

- A Social, Emotional Aspects of Learning Activity
- A time for prayer (* See below EYFS end of the day prayer)
- **Mathematics** – which will follow the EYFS medium term planning in school linked to White Rose Maths.
- **Literacy: Reading (Phonics)** – which will follow the EYFS medium term planning in school e.g. Phonic Songbirds letters and sounds phonics plan. Reading links online will be made linked to letters and sounds during weekly activities.
- **Literacy: Writing** – which will follow the EYFS medium term planning in school. Activities will link to three developmental stages including activities for Gross Motor Upper Body Movement, Gross motor mid to upper body movement and Fine motor development - including Funky Fingers activities
- **Understanding the world:** children will complete an Understanding of the world activity based on their area of learning (see school website for planning) at the time of isolation. This will directly correlate to the Science medium term planning being followed in school.
- **People and Communities:** children will complete an activity based on their area of learning (see school website for EYFS planning) at the time of isolation. This will directly correlate to the EYFS plan being followed in school.
- **Physical Development:** The EYFS teacher will encourage the children to complete as many physical activities as possible during the lockdown period. Families may want to view the EYFS long term plan – Physical Development as a guide regarding P.E. skills taught at the time of isolation. This will directly correlate to the EYFS plan being followed in school.
- **Home school timetable**

At home families may want to follow the EYFS timetable on a 5 - day cycle. Families may determine how long each session lasts depending on the developmental needs of their child.
