Theme – All about me

1. Play Matters

L.O. – For the children to learn through play

Start the day with 'Investigations' this is an opportunity for you to play alongside your child following their own interests using their own toys in the home. Talking with your child about what they are doing and joining in with their play is very important for your child's speech and vocabulary development.

2. White Rose Maths

L.O. For the children to make simple patterns

View — 'I Went Walking' by Sue Williams

This vibrant storybook is similar to Brown Bear Brown Bear What Do You See? in some ways, but it adds some interesting complexity to a pattern story.

Use objects from around the home such as socks, Lego, cars, action figures, spoons or tins from the kitchen cupboard. Ask your child to create their own repeating patterns. Can Mam or Dad or who ever you live with copy and continue your patterns?

3. Phonics

L.O. – For the children to hear and say the initial sounds in words.

Reporter – Ask your child to be the Reporter today. Can they find and copy the letters Hh in your home and draw a picture to match. It could be a picture of their house maybe or a horse or a hat!

Photographer – Ask your child to find objects that start with the letter h around the home.

Take one photo of your collection of objects to send to Ms Lilley.

4. Emergent Writing

L.O. For the children to support and extend their elbow pivot.

Outside – Provide your child with a stiff, outside, sweeping brush. A sweeping motion with a stiff outside brush is great to develop elbow pivots. If you have 2 brushes you and your child could have a sweeping race through piles of leaves in the garden, yard or local park.

5. Higher Dexterity Writing

L.O. For the children to form recognisable letter shapes

You may like to complete the rainbow letter h using many colours. Start at the dot and always follow the arrow.
