



My name is Mr Singh. I was a foundry worker in the Punjab, India. One day whilst at work, I heard that some of my colleagues had gone to the UK to work in the foundries in some of the big cities. The British government had been encouraging people from the colonies, like me, to come to the UK and help rebuild the country after World War 2. So, in the summer of 1952 I left the Punjab to start a new life in the UK.
