Write a short story about what you think happened to the tiger. Where do you think he went at the end of the book?


Draw a picture of a tiger. Can you label it? You might want to add some adjectives (describing words)

Collective Worship – Is it fair?

What do you think Joseph would have felt like leaving the prison? If it was a movie, what kind of music would be playing in the background?

"I told the Pharaoh that it wasn't me that was able to interpret the dreams, rather it was my God that could interpret them. If he told them to me, I would ask God to give me the meaning of the dreams. It turns out that Egypt is in for 7 years of amazing food harvests, there will be so much food around. But Egypt shouldn't waste the food, 'cause just as the thin cows and rough heads of grain followed the fat cows and grain there will be 7 years of famine that follow the 7 good years. 








