Reception Remote learning activities

### Week 1 Friday 8th January 2021

## 1. Play Matters

L.O. - For the children to learn through play

Start the day with 'Investigations' this is an opportunity for you to play alongside your child following their own interests using their own toys in the home. Talking with your child about what they are doing is very important for your child's speech and vocabulary development.

### 2. White Rose Maths

L.O. For the children to be introduced to zero

<u>View</u> You Tube - Alice the Camel Has Five Humps | Animal Song | Children Love to Sing (1.54mins)

<u>Prompts for learning</u> — Use popular counting back songs such as 5 Speckled frogs. Represent each verse with counters on a 5 frame, displaying the numerals alongside. Ask them to predict how many frogs will be left as each one dives into the pool. What about the last frog? How could we show this on our 5 frames? Which numeral should we use?

### **Enhancements for learning** - Small World

As the children play, prompt them to notice where they see zero E.g. Could we park 0 cars in this car park? If there are 5 horses and 2 fields, how many horses could be in each field, could one field have zero horse? If all 5 monkeys have fallen off the bed, how many are left on the bed (zero) etc etc

### 2. Phonics

L.O. — For the children to blend letters together to read words.

<u>'Reporter'.</u> Your child's job today is to play with the sounds we have taught to date using them to build words. The letters are -

's ctqpaorldinbfhruvyzmjke'

They can be found in the story via You Tube - Story time: The Odd Pet by Julia Donaldson | Oxford Owl (2.13mins) This version is read by Julia Donaldson but you can't see the words.

## Let's play- Letters and Words

What you need:

- A whiteboard, chalkboard or several pieces of paper
- 2 coloured whiteboard markers or 2 coloured chalks or 2 coloured felt tip pens

#### What to do:

- 1. Split you and your child into 2 teams
- 2. Draw a classic noughts and crosses grid with nine spaces
- 3. Your child has one colour marker pen and you have another colour marker pen
- 4. Start off by choosing 2 letters from the letters below for example 'm' and 's'.
- 5. Decide who is 'm' and who is 's'.
- 6. Flip a coin to decide who goes first
- 7. The first person to go writes their letter anywhere on the grid they then have to say a word that begins with that letter sound for example if 's' goes first they write 's' on the grid and say 'sun'.
- 8. The next person has their turn. Keep going until the winner has 3 letters the same in a row. Repeat with 2 new letters.

Letters to choose from are - 's c t g p a o r l d i n b f h r u v y z m j k e'

Alternatively, you may wish to write the letter for your child and have them say the sound only and not a word.

<u>Challenge and extend</u> You may wish to extend this activity by asking each team to come up with more than one word for each sound written on the grid or use rhyming words instead of phonemes for example instead of saying s they say sat. Instead of saying m they choose a word that rhymes with sat so mat etc.

Photographer Your child's job today is to take a photograph of the High Frequency Tricky Word (HFTW) activity 'Give me a ...'

### What you need:

- This list of HFTW I, a, of, is, the, he, to, will, better, her, hole, have and introducing now
- Cheerleader pom poms or music shakers or 2 scarves or 2 tea towels

### What to do:

- 1. Tell your child you are both going to be cheerleaders. Then have a practise at shaking their pom poms, shakers, scarves or tea towels.
- 2. At first the adult can act as the caller for the cheerleading team to show your child what to do.
- 3. Then take it in turns to call out the individual sounds in each high frequency tricky word, followed by the word itself.
- 4. Winners are the cheerleaders that try their hardest to get the sounds right and shout the loudest!

# Let's make Snow dough

### What you need:

- Half a cup of white hair conditioner
- 2 to 3 cups of Bicarbonate of soda

### What to do:

- 1. Pour half a cup of white hair conditioner into a bowl
- 2. Measure out 2 to 3 cups of bicarbonate of soda and place those into the bowl with the hair conditioner.
- 3. Mix together with a spoon.
- 4. Bring together with your hands and place on a tray.
- 5. Enjoy squashing, pinching and squeezing.
