1. Play Matters

L.O. - For the children to learn through play

Start the day with 'Investigations' this is an opportunity for you to play alongside your child following their own interests using their own toys in the home. Talking with your child about what they are doing is very important for your child's holistic development.

"The art of play is an important tool that influences a child's life. The primary goals of childhood are to grow, play and learn. It is often though playing that children learn to make sense of the world around them. It is a child's 'job' or 'occupation' to play to develop physical coordination, emotional maturity, social skills to interact with other children and self confidence to try new experiences and explore new environments.'

2. White Rose Maths

<u>L.O.</u> For the children to continue to understand that when comparing numbers, one quantity can be more than, the same as or fewer than another quantity.

View - Room on the Broom - Read by Alan Mandel (7.41 mins)

Prompts for learning

Working with your child, provide yourself and them with a plate and give both of you a handful of snacks such as grapes or crackers. Do you both have the same? Is it fair? Encourage them to notice who has more snack and who has less and to share out the snack fairly. Can they check that both of you now has the same? Could you include siblings with this activity?

Enhancements for learning

Provide a set of dot plates with different arrangements of 0 to 5 dots.

(You could use paper plates and draw the dots on or use normal household plates, make a set of dot cards and place 1 dot card in the centre of one plate)

Ask your child -

Can you find a plate with 4 dots?

With more/fewer than 4 dots?

Can you put the plates in order?

One of the plates is missing. (choose a plate to hide, but no peaking!)

Can your child work out which one?

Repeat with different numbers 0-5

2. Phonics

<u>L.O.</u> — For the children to use their phonic knowledge to recognise initial letter sounds and apply them in context.

Reporter and Photographer jobs.

Today the children's jobs are to report back to an adult and take a photo of this lovely phonics word game called 'Flipping Phonics' making words using the single sounds taught to date - 's c t g p a o r l d i n b f h r u v y z m j k e'.

Flipping Phonics

What you need:

- Paper (brown or yellow if you have it)
- Felt tip pen
- A frying pan
- A fish slice or spatula

What you need:

- 1. Use your paper to cut out small pancake shapes.
- 2. On one side of the pancake write the words cat, fat, leg, beg, dog, zog

- 3. On the other sound write the initial sound of the word.
- 4. Place the pancakes in the pan with the initial sound facing upwards.
- 5. Adult says the first word 'cat'
- 6. The child scans the frying pan for the initial sound 'c' and flips over the pancake and reads the word 'cat'.
- 7. If they are correct they keep their pancake, if not it returns back to the frying pan.
- 8. Continue play until all the words are read.

Alternatively:

Stick to searching for the initial letter sound only.

Challenge and extend:

Once all of the words have been flipped and read. Challenge your child to match the rhyming words together. Can they write a list of the 3 pairs of rhyming words?

Have fun!

4. Emergent Writing

L.O. For the children to explore what their hands and fingers can do.

<u>Provide</u> opportunities for your child to explore what their hands can do using malleable materials activities and recipes

Finger Paint

You will need:

- 2 cups of cornflour
- 1 cup of cold water
- 4 and a half cups of boiling water
- Food colouring

Method:

- 1. Mix the cornflour with the cold water and stir together.
- 2. Pour in the boiling water (ADULT ONLY!!!!) and stir.
- 3. When it becomes the consistency of thick custard it's done.

4. At this point you can divide the mixture between smaller bowls and add different colour food colouring or keep the mixture in one big bowl and add one colour of food colouring.

5. Higher Dexterity Writing

L.O. For the children to make marks or begin to form recognisable letter shapes or to spell simple words or to write simple sentences including a capital letter, finger spaces and a full stop depending on your child's developmental stage.

- Later, you could put your listening ears on and listen to 'Old Jacks Boat: Rockpool Tales'
 via <u>CBeebies radio</u> sharing a story about the 'The Short-Sighted Walrus' A large
 creature is blocking the sun from the rockpool. Can the rock poolers help?

You may like to write three facts about the Walrus that you have learned today 😊
