

Emotional Well-Being:

Today we are going to be ordering lengths. Remember to look at the units of measurement. That means whether something is measured in mm, cm or m. A good way to remember their order is:

mm = mini

cm = small

m = massive

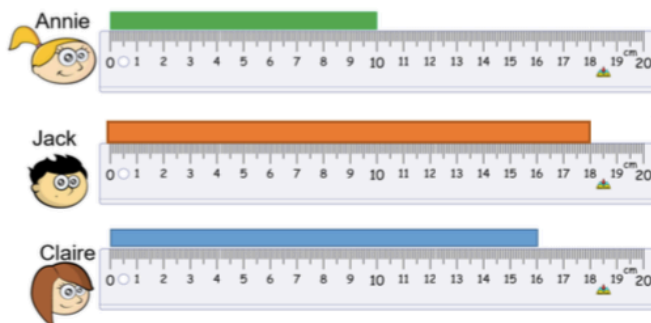
