right angles $=$ exactly $90^{\circ}$
acute angles $=0-89^{\circ}$ smaller than a right angle
obtuse angles $=$ more than $90^{\circ}$ but less than $180^{\circ}$
reflex angles $=$ anything between $181^{\circ}$ and $360^{\circ}$

A boy in ancient Greece, called Demosthenes, struggled to talk properly, he was so determined to improve such a basic skill that he would practise talking, putting phrases together, reciting poems and repeating various sounds. As he improved, it is said that he would practise with pebbles in his mouth (don't try this yourself). He became famous for his speeches and his ability to talk. Once you have mastered a particular part of a skill, like Demosthenes, it is time to practise things that are slightly more difficult. If you think you have the skill of patience, try being around annoying people without losing your cool or think of bigger and better ways of being kind. Talents and skills improve with effort and practise.
