Making mistakes is part of life and should be celebrated. Instead of saying ‘I can’t do it’ when you get your spellings wrong, what you really mean is I can’t do it yet!’

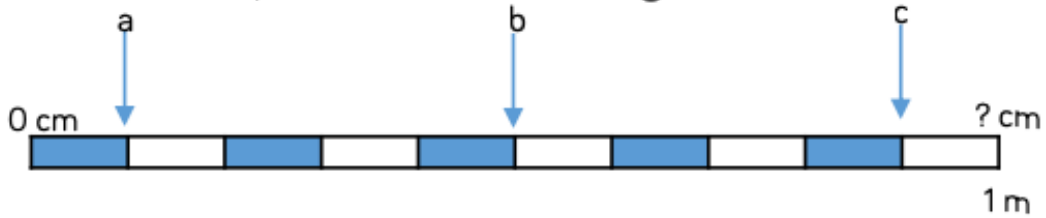

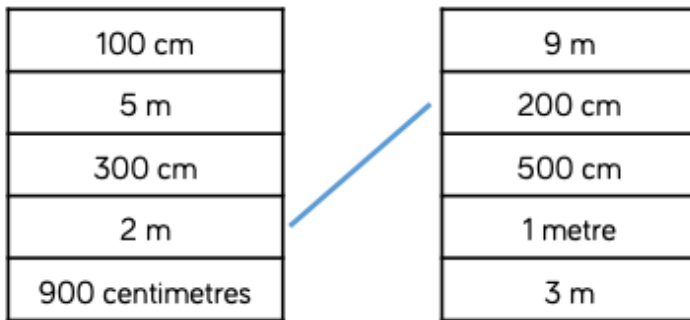

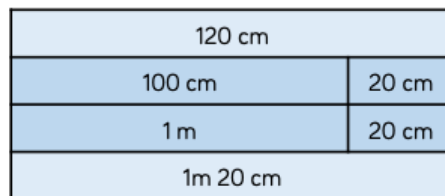
