Maths

Problem Solving/Investigation Friday

Today I would like you to complete a trial and improvement investigation to find some four-digit target numbers (see attached).

Simply 'having a go' is a great way to make a start on a mathematical problem. Whatever happens, you will have learnt more about the situation and can then tweak your approach. This activity requires you to use this 'trial and improvement' way of working.

What will happen to Joseph?


Will Brian tell the Pharaoh of Joseph and will Pharaoh release him?







How to Write a Good Story

Characters

Who are the characters in your story?



Opening

Introduce the characters and the location of the story.



Dilemma

Write about a problem that is happening in your story. What is it that has gone wrong?



Bring everything in the story to an end and make sure the problem has been fixed.

Setting

Where is your story set? Is it in a forest, a town, in the park or somewhere else?







Begin to write about what is happening at the start of your story. Don't forget to use the characters you introduced at the beginning of your story.







Resolution

Write about how the problem will be fixed. Think about how the characters might work together to solve whatever has gone wrong.
