## Collective Worship - The Rich Fool

Once upon a time, there was a goose that laid golden eggs. Each morning the goose would lay just one egg and the old man and woman collected and sold the egg. Over time the old man and woman became very rich, but they were never satisfied. They were greedy and wanted more than one egg a day. Frustrated, they thought that if they cut open the goose, they would get all the eggs in one go. They killed and cut open the goose to find out that she was just like any other goose.
