Imagine you are going on a bear hunt! What would you need? Write a list of supplies.


Following the same sentence structure, add a new hurdle for the family's journey. E.g. "Oh no a ______, a ______.

Create a warning poster to put outside the cave to tell people not to disturb the sleeping bear!

Bears hibernate in the winter. What does this mean? Can you draw and label some other animals that hibernate.

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
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
