Imagine you are going on a bear hunt! What would you need? Write a list of supplies.


Following the same sentence structure, add a new hurdle for the family's journey. E.g. "Oh no a _____, a _____.

Create a 2D or 3D map following the story from the house all the way to the cave.

Write a setting description for one of the different parts of the story. The grass, river, mud, forest, snow or the cave.

Write a letter from the bear to the children to explain he just wants to be friends.



Design and create a cave for your own teddy bear! It needs to be dark and cosy for your bear.

Write a story based on a different animal! E.g. We're going on a flamingo hunt. — Perhaps you can link it to our work on Antarctic and African animals?

Create a warning poster to put outside the cave to tell people not to disturb the sleeping bear!

Bears hibernate in the winter. What does this mean? Can you draw and label some other animals that hibernate.

Maths

This week we are going to be continuing our work on length and height. Using a ruler, we are going to be looking at measuring in centimetres today. Have a look at the questions on the worksheet.

Afterwards if you have a ruler or measuring tape at home you might want to practice measing object in your house — I'd love to see some pictures on Class Dojo.
