English — Reading


Read or listen to the story 'Mr Wolf's Pancakes' - <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=6_VosU2oLgY</u> Pick a reading activity to do every day this week.

Make some instructions of how to make pancakes.

A recipe book is a non-fiction book. Can you make a list of the other non-fiction books you can think of?

Read the story about one of Mr Wolf's neighbours – Chicken Licken, Wee Willie Winky, Gingerbread Man, Little Red Riding Hood and the 3 Little Pigs.

Write a shopping list for Mr Wolf. What ingredients will he need to make pancakes? Don't forget about toppings! Draw a map of Mr Wolf's journey to the shop – make sure to include his neighbour's houses.



In traditional fairy tales, the wolf is usually the villain – e.g. The Big Bad Wolf in Little Red Riding Hood, 3 Little Pigs. Is this true in this story? Explain your answer.

If you were Mr Wolf would you give the neighbours some pancakes? Explain your answer.

Do you think Mr Wolf did the right thing at the end of the story? Explain your answer.

Perhaps you could use your instructions and shopping list to help you make pancakes next Tuesday on pancake day!

We are thankful for stories that help us to reflect on positive and important human qualities. At this time of year when we think about love, my we show our love, care and concern for our friends, families and communities.


