English — Reading


Read or listen to the story 'Mr Wolf's Pancakes' - https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=6_VosU2oLgY
Pick a reading activity to do every day this week.

Make some instructions of how to make pancakes.

A recipe book is a non-fiction book. Can you make a list of the other non-fiction books you can think of?

Read the story about one of Mr Wolf's neighbours — Chicken Licken, Wee Willie Winky, Gingerbread Man, Little Red Riding Hood and the 3 Little Pigs.

Write a shopping list for Mr Wolf. What ingredients will he need to make pancakes? Don't forget about toppings! Draw a map of Mr Wolf's journey to the shop — make sure to include his neighbour's houses.



In traditional fairy tales, the wolf is usually the villain — e.g. The Big Bad Wolf in Little Red Riding Hood, 3 Little Pigs. Is this true in this story? Explain your answer.

If you were Mr Wolf would you give the neighbours some pancakes? Explain your answer.

Do you think Mr Wolf did the right thing at the end of the story?

Explain your answer.

Perhaps you could use your instructions and shopping list to help you make pancakes next Tuesday on pancake day!

PSHE

This half term we have been learning all about relationships. We have focused on friendships and what good and bad relationships mean. On Sunday it is St. Valentine's day. Today I would like you to fill out this Valentine's sheet describing what love is, who you love, what a friend is and then you can write an acrostic poem for the word love – we did this in the autumn – each line starts with the letters LOVE.

Collective Worship - Be My Valentine

In the English language we have different words that mean the same thing, for example, an eraser and a rubber both refer to something that rubs out mistakes made when using a pencil. We also have words that sometimes mean more than one thing. For example, the word seat can mean a stool, chair, bench or even floor. Love is another word that we use but will have different meanings. Think about the word love in the following sentences:

- I love my hamster
- I love my mum
- I love my Xbox
- I'd love a drink
- I love my wife
- I love my children
- I love my brother
- I love my boyfriend
- I'd love to go on holiday

We use the word 'love' to mean 'enjoy', 'like' and 'appreciate'. Do you love a hamster with the same love that you love your mum or your nana? We often use the word love to refer to 'care'. In caring for his community, St. Valentine was able to demonstrate that he also loved the people around him.




