In the middle of the front row is the 'hooker', it is the hooker's job to get the ball and pass it backwards with his or her feet. Beside them are the loose head and tight head prop. They all work slightly differently, but all with the same aim.

We have a range of clubs and opportunities that enable different skills to be practised and enjoyed. Even though we have our goals in school, we all enjoy different activities including sport, art, music, reading, maths, trips and visits.
