

Emotional Well-Being:

Taking time for yourself to do something that relaxes you is so important. 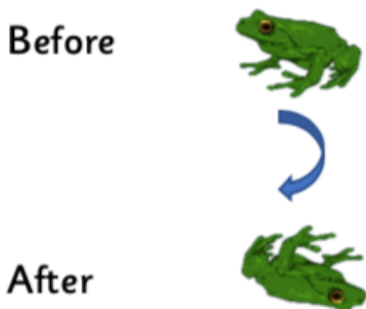
