

Emotional Well-Being:

Collective Worship:

Can anyone give me an example of something you love? Why do you love it/ him/her? How do you show that you love it/him/her? Yesterday we talked about the word love meaning different things, for example, is 'I love my Xbox' the same as

'I love my mum'. There is a very famous passage of the Bible that is read when describing love. We heard the passage during our assembly on *Monday*. Two versions are given here as some parts are easier to understand in one and other parts are easier to explain in the other.

Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonour others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. Love never fails. (1 Corinthians 13:4-7 NIV)
Love is patient and kind; it is not jealous or conceited or proud; love is not ill-mannered or selfish or irritable; love does not keep a record of wrongs; love is not happy with evil, but is happy with the truth. Love never gives up; and its faith, hope, and patience never fail. (1 Corinthians 13:4-7 GNB)

This explanation of love helps us to think about how we can show care for our own family, friends and community.

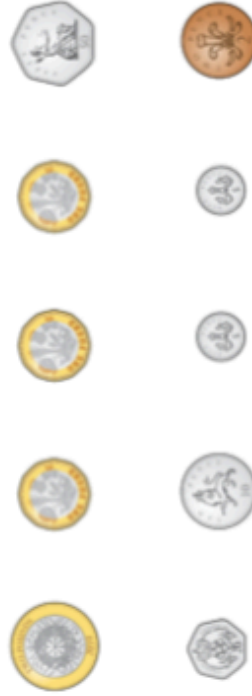
