

Lesson 2 – Stars and Constellations

Today we are looking at stars and how they are arranged in the sky to create constellations. Stars are giant balls of gas in outer space, just like our sun! Lots of stars in our solar system can be seen with the naked eye (without a telescope) when it's dark and there aren't many clouds. I would like you to do the following to improve your understanding about stars and constellations:
