

### Prayer and Reflection Resource:

Can anyone recount the story about the two brothers that we heard yesterday? Can anyone tell me any of the Ten Commandments? In the Bible, The Ten Commandments along with other laws were given to a man called Moses over 3000 years ago to show the Israelites how God wanted them to live. The last five of the commandments would not have surprised the Israelites, do not murder, steal, or lie all seem like obvious rules. Most of the 'do not's' come at the end of the Ten Commandments. The first few commandments focus on respect, respect for God and others, respect for ourselves, ensuring we have time to rest, and respect for our parents (and those who are around that want to help us). Those with a respectful attitude are usually those who wouldn't even consider breaking the do not's that come later in the Ten Commandments.
