With COVID restrictions lifted for returning to school, we will be spending

September making sure our children are settled in their new routines and enjoying mixing again as a whole school. Therefore, we will begin welcoming families back **into school** from the beginning of October with our first event being Family Friday on Friday 4<sup>th</sup> October. #### Start and end times

Children must now enter the school site through the side gate. The gate leading into the staff car park must not be used and will be shut on a morning. Any children who are accessing our Breakfast Club can arrive at school from 7.45am and must use the side gate.

All children are to arrive at school between 8.45 and 8.55am and filter straight into classrooms where their class teacher will be waiting. Please see below which entrance to school your child will access:

#### **Snack and Packed Lunch**

Please can we remind you around the expectations of what children can bring to school for snack and packed lunch.

Packed lunches and snacks should **not** contain the following:

- crisps (other than baked)
- confectionery such as chocolate bars, chocolate-coated biscuits and sweets. (Cakes and biscuits are allowed but encourage your child to eat these only as part of a balanced meal.)
- highly processed foods such as Dairylea dunkers, Cheese Strings, Fruit Winders
- pastry products such as sausage rolls, individual pies and pasties
- nuts


Obviously we would love as many people to take part as possible (parents, grandparents, even family dogs!). After what has been an incredibly difficult 18 months, what better

If so, you need to complete an application online to tell us which school you would like your child to attend from September 2022.

Visit www.durham.gov.uk/schooladmissions where you can access a useful guide to help with your application. We encourage you to apply online wherever possible as although restrictions have been lifted, staff will in the main be working from home due to the Coronavirus pandemic. If you are unable to apply online, paper application forms are available on request.

You still need to apply even if your child attends the nursery unit attached to the school, or already has a sibling at the school. You will also need to apply for a place in Year 3 in a junior school for an older child.

## Applications open 6 September 2021 and close midnight 15 January 2022.
