Lesson 2	LO: To edit email content and add an attachment  Can I log in to my email account?  Can I send an email with an attachment?  Can I reply to an existing email?	<ul><li>Model adding an attachment.</li><li>Discuss how this is useful.</li><li>Children to add an attachment.</li></ul>
Lesson 3	<ul> <li>LO: To understand the importance of being kind online and what this looks like</li> <li>Can I understand how to use positive language within an email?</li> <li>Can I recognise when digital behaviour is unkind?</li> <li>Can I explain how to be a responsible digital citizen when I encounter others online?</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Discuss how people can be unkind online.</li> <li>Break the cycle of negativity by sending a positive email.</li> </ul>
Lesson 4	LO: To understand that cyberbullying involves being unkind online  Can I recognise unkind behaviour and know how to report it?  Can I be a responsible digital citizen?  Can I offer advice to support other people who are victims of cyberbullying?	<ul> <li>Explain the definition of cyberbullying and discuss examples.</li> <li>Discuss scenarios and how to safely get help for the situation.</li> </ul>

LO: To understand that not all emails are genuine  Can I recognise when an email might be fake?  Can I understand that I shouldn't click on links in an email unless I know what it is?  Can I explain what to do if I suspect an email is fake?	<ul> <li>Discuss and show examples of fake emails.</li> <li>Write an email to the teachers explaining how to spot a fake email.</li> </ul>
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
