

School Meals / Packed Lunches

Our school kitchen has a new menu starting in November. As always, it is a three-week rolling menu. I am sure you will agree there is lots of choice for our children wishing to have a home cooked, hot meal, as the days grow colder. School meals are priced at £10.75 per week for our children in KS2 (Years 3,4,5&6). Children in years Reception, 1 & 2 are entitled to a Universal Free School Meal daily through the government scheme.

Please can we ask if children are changing from Packed Lunch to School Lunches, or vice versa, that **you inform the school**. This enables us to supply the kitchen with correct numbers for ordering purposes.

Snack and Packed Lunch

Please can we remind you around the expectations of what children can bring to school for snack and packed lunch. Packed lunches and snacks should **not** contain the following:

• crisps (other than baked)

• confectionery such as chocolate bars, chocolate-coated biscuits and sweets. (Cakes and biscuits are allowed but encourage your child to eat these only as part of a balanced meal.)

 highly processed foods such as Dairylea dunkers, Cheese Strings, Fruit Winders

- pies and pasties
- nuts

pastry products such as sausage rolls
