# The Death of Her Majesty the Queen

# **Announcement from Church of England Diocese of Durham**

We join with the whole nation, and friends across the world, in expressing our sorrow at the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. Amidst the pain and grief we also lift prayers of thanksgiving for her life, service and example to our nation and to the world.

#### Statement from Bishop Paul

The Bishop of Durham, the Right Reverend Paul Butler said: "Her Majesty has served this nation with such deep love for the people and care for the well-being of all. Her devotion to her duty and responsibilities has



been amazing. All of this has been firmly rooted in her deep personal faith in Jesus Christ as her Lord and Saviour.

"We give thanks to God for her, knowing that she rests in peace and will rise in glory. Our prayers are with our new monarch, King Charles, all the Royal Family and our nation in this time of sadness and grief."

#### Elizabeth's Life and Reign

Elizabeth II, born Elizabeth Alexandria Mary on April 21st, 1926, was the eldest daughter of George VI. She became Queen of the United Kingdom and other Commonwealth realms when her father died on February 6th, 1952.

Through her marriage to HRH Prince Philip she had four children Charles, Prince of Wales; Anne, Princess Royal; Prince Andrew, Duke of York; and Prince Edward, Earl of Wessex as well as eight grandchildren and seven great-grandchildren.

During her reign she was advisor and confidante to 12 Prime Ministers, including Winston Churchill, made over 100 state visits all over the world, and has been the longest-serving British monarch in modern history. She became patron of more than 600 charities and organisations, and awarded for 400.000 honours.

She exemplified a life of sacrifice and service, attributing her faith in Jesus Christ, and his life and teaching, as the source and motivation for her long years of service.

I know just how much I rely on my faith to guide me through the good times and the bad. Each day is a new beginning. I know that the only way to live my life is to try to do what is right, to take the long view, to give of my best in all that the day brings, and to put my trust in God ... I draw strength from the message of hope in the Christian gospel.'

Will your child turn 5 between 1 September 2023 and 31 August 2024?

If so, you need to complete an application online to tell us which school you would like your child to attend from September 2023.

Visit **www.durham.gov.uk/schooladmissions** where you can access a useful guide to help with your application. We encourage you to apply online wherever possible. Although restrictions have been lifted, staff will sometimes be working from home. If you are unable to apply online, paper application forms are available on request.

You still need to apply even if your child attends the nursery unit attached to the school, or already has a sibling at the school. You will also need to apply for a place in Year 3 in a junior school for an older child.

Applications open 5 September 2022 and close midnight 15 January 2023.
