Mathematics -

Phase 5 - Growing 6 7 & 8

Length and height

- *For the children to begin by using language to describe length and height.
- *For the children to make direct comparisons.
- *For the children to be encouraged to use more specific mathematical language relating to length (longer, shorter) Height (taller, shorter) Breadth (wide and narrower)
- *For the children to be encouraged to make direct comparisons using objects such as blocks or cubes to measure items. E.g., The sand tray is 4 blocks long, the table is 5 blocks long. The sand tray is 'shorter' than the table.
