Play matters in Elm class which last week ranged from-

<u>Blake</u> has been keen to learn through play in the writing area using whiteboards. "We playing teachers. We teach Sounds Write and numbers" she shares. Blake then demonstrated that she can form numerals from 0 to 51.

## **Mathematics**

Spring term | Block 2 - Mass and capacity

For the children to:

Step 1 – Compare Mass

\*Children will become more familiar with using balance scales and distinguish between the different quantities on either side.

# Step 2 – Find a balance

\*In this small step, children will further explore mass and progress to discovering how to find a balance.

## <u>Step 3</u> – Explore Capacity

\*In this small step, children build on their understanding of 'full' and 'empty' to further investigate different capacities and how they relate to each other.

# <u>Step 4</u> – Compare Capacity

\*Children will continue to explore capacity in this small step and will move on to making comparisons. Encourage children to make direct comparisons by pouring from one container to another.
