



# Elm Class Update - Week 2

Dear parents and carers,

It has been a wonderful first week back for all the children.

Looking ahead, this week the children will begin thinking about <u>composting</u>. In Elm class outdoor space, we have a large compost bin. We welcome families to start bringing into school compostable waste in a small <u>compostable bag</u>. Organic waste such as coffee grinds, teabags, egg shells and vegetable scraps would be wonderful. Please don't bring processed foods or meat. Each day the children will be supported to put their organic waste in the compost bins ready to make compost stew! You may already compost organic waste at home in your yard, garden or allotment, that's wonderful! If you can, it would be great if you could have a chat with your child about composting, what it is and why we do it.

<u>Gardening</u> - Our seed potatoes will be put on the windowsill to begin to 'chit' during the coming weeks. Last week the children have begun digging over the raised beds ready to plant French Climbing Beans this week. In the coming weeks the children will be planting potatoes, radishes, turnips and lots more including salad vegetables and soft fruits.

<u>Wheelie Wednesday</u> continues. If you would like your child to participate then they are welcome to bring a scooter/ balance bike/ Pedal bike and a helmet with them on Wednesday morning and park their scooter/balance bike in the MUGA until lunchtime play.

Play matters in Elm class. Last week...

<u>Jacob</u> - Wonderful to observe Jacob in the gardening sensory tray working alongside his friend Alex. Using the towel, filling pots and planting flowers. Jacob demonstrated wonderful fine motor skill using the gardening tools.

<u>Alex</u> - As above Alex played alongside his friend Jacob in the Gardening area last week planting flowers. It was lovely to see Alex demonstrating our school value of friendship.

<u>Mille</u> - Was keen to write in the Writers Workshop last week exploring the large whiteboards. Millie divided her board into quarters drawing a picture to represent 4 celebrations (drawing on prior learning). Millie demonstrated she can use her Sounds Write phonic skills when writing independently in the areas.

<u>Blake</u> - Was keen to explore the watercolour area last week. Blake worked alongside her friend Eveline. Blake was keen to mix her own colours. We talked about the special equipment needed to

do that called a 'mixing palette'. Blake demonstrated very good fine motor skill using her wrist pivots and finger manipulation when handling the fine, thin watercolour brushes.
