

Easington C of E Primary School Sports Premium Report

Our Sports Premium allowance for the academic year 2023-24 is £17060 (£16000 + £10 per pupil). The premium will be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles. The Department for Education's vision for the Primary PE and Sports Premium is that ALL pupils leaving primary school should be physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

We endeavour to see an improvement against the following 5 key indicators:

- 1. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- 2. Engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity
- 3. The profile of PE and Sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
- 4. Broader experience of a range of sports and physical activities offered to all pupils
- 5. Increased participation in competitive sport
