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SENDIASS Drop In

Durham SEND Information Advice and Support Service (SENDIASS) drop-in sessions - Durham County Council

Durham SEND Information Advice and Support Service (SENDIASS) is a statutory service supporting parents/carers of children with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) and children and young people with SEND.

They provide confidential, impartial support and advice for parents, carers, children and young people up to the age of 25 years in relation to special educational needs and disability. SENDIASS operates at 'arm's length' from the council.

SENDIASS run drop-in session at the Family Hubs. These are for parents and carers who are not currently open to or being supported by SENDIASS. If you already have an allocated SENDIASS caseworker, please contact them directly if you need any further advice.

If you have questions about your child's educational needs or provision you can pop into one of the monthly drop-in sessions in our Family Hubs.

We do not have strict appointment slots but anticipate that conversations will take around 20 minutes. If SENDIASS feel that more support if needed they will take your details to allocate a caseworker.

You don't need to go to the Family Hub closest to where you live, or nearest your child's school, you can go to whichever session suits you and your family best.

Educational Psychologist Drop In

Educational Psychology drop-in sessions for parents and carers - Durham County Council

Educational psychologists help children and young people with a wide range of different needs, such as, learning, communication and language, social and emotional-wellbeing, practical skills or being independent. We can help if, for example:

- You are worried your child isn't talking enough.
- You struggle to know what is best to do when your child has a 'tantrum'.
- You've noticed your child doesn't play with other children much.
- Your child is always on the go and doesn't sit still for any activity.
- Your child really struggles to be apart from you.

If you're concerned about your child, pop into one of our drop-in sessions, where one of our friendly team can offer advice, talk through your concerns and help you plan what to do next.

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Daisy Chain coffee mornings and workshops

Daisy Chain will be running coffee mornings in Family Hubs for parents and carers of children diagnosed, on the pathway or who have been identified by a professional as having a need relating to autism, attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD), foetal alcohol spectrum disorder (FASD), sensory processing differences, anxiety and social and communication differences. The groups will:

- listen, offer guidance and tell you about services that are available in your local area
- direct you to services that can make a difference and empower you
- increase your knowledge, understanding and skills to support your child
